#### **Play Dates**

This is a reminder that, during the national lockdown, children should not be visiting the homes of other children, other than for childcare purposes. We frequently have children telling us that they are going to someone else's house for a playdate or a sleepover. Under the current restrictions, this is not permitted. ### **Road Safety**

I have had a concerned resident contact me about parents waiting and chatting in Effra Road after school – he is very concerned that there will be an accident soon. Even though we are part of the School Streets' Scheme, Effra Road is still open to residents to drive down. Please do take care, especially at the end of the school day.

I have also seen children cycling/scooting down the middle of Effra Road – this is not safe. Please ensure that children are with you at all times. It would be safer if children push their scooters or bikes further down the road before getting on them.

#### Holy Trinity Road Safety Week - 23rd-27th November 2020.

To highlight road safety, we will be holding some road safety awareness activities from 23-27<sup>th</sup> November in school time. On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> November we will have a **Speed Down Dress Up Superhero Day.** All children can come dressed\* as their favourite superhero from real-life or fiction. For this, we are asking for a £1 donation from each child to raise money for BRAKE, the road safety charity that supports victims of road accidents and campaigns for better road safety and awareness. We will send a link in due course about how to donate to BRAKE.

There will be a prize per year group for the most imaginative costume!

\*We recognise that shops are not currently open at the moment. There really is no need for children to have elaborate costumes, just imaginative – the simpler the better!
