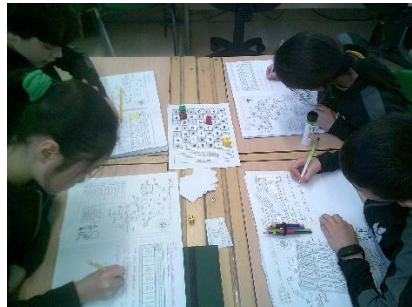
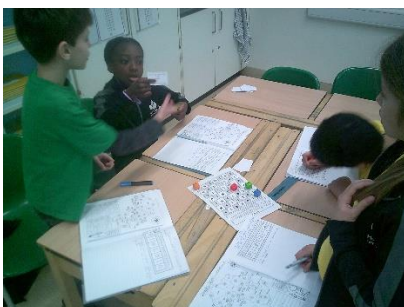
Rory, one of our Year 6 pupils came to show me his poem, all about our school. It was so touching, that I wanted to share it with you all too. Well done Rory!
